- A. Athletic Trainers in the Operating Room Room: CSB 350
Speaker: Ryan Hedwall, MA, LAT, ATC, OTC
Event Descriptions: Designed and equipped to provide specialized care to patients with specific conditions, the staff of an Operating Room (OR) is comparable to an athletic team. This presentation will cover the understanding of barrier to obtaining OR privileges and scope of practice and competencies.

- B. Dermatology in Sports Medicine Room: CSB 312
Speaker: B.J. Anderson, M.D.
Event Description: Protecting against bacterial, fungal and viral skin infection seen in athletes, Dr. Anderson will express the importance of clinical diagnosis of skin conditions and the recommendation for treatment of skin infections.

 Event Description: Application of the Vestibular Ocular Motor Screen (VOMS) in the diagnosis and management of concussion across various settings. The presentation will review the development and background of the VOMS across a variety of settings, explain the importance and use of the VOMS on diagnosis and management, and the ability to apply each component of VOMS to functional ability.
